Dear 4-H Families:

This past year a grant was received from the Department of Agriculture to establish five 22 x 48 foot high tunnel green houses on site at the school districts of Bayfield, Ashland, Drummond, South Shore and Washburn. These high tunnel's will extend the growing season and be creatively integrated into each schools Farm to School curriculum.



One component to the program will establish garden clubs at the each school to teach interested middle and high school students how to create and sustain a youth centered Agripreneur Program.

Club members will learn how to select and balance their crop selection to create a supply of produce that can be purchased by the school for their lunch program. During the summer months, the clubs will continue with their crops and sell them locally through established networks and local farmers markets.

If your son or daughter would be interested in being involved with this program they should contact the high tunnel club advisor at their school.

New enrollment packets have been distributed to 4-H Club Organizational Leaders. 4-H Enrollment will take place through the same 4-H Online website that was used last year. To re-enroll go to the wi.4HOnline.com. If you have any questions about accessing the website, please do not hesitate to call us at the 4-H office.

Once again our youngest 4-H members created and brought many wonderful entries to the fair. Many of them participated in the face to face judging with older 4-H members on Friday where we got to learn first

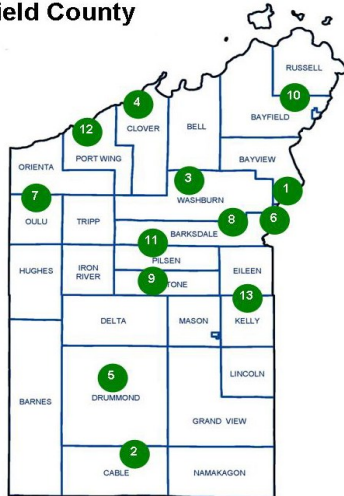

- ¼ tsp. crushed red pepper flakes

- 11 ounces creamy goat cheese such as Montrachet, crumbled

- ½ cup good olive oil
- ¼ cup freshly squeezed lemon juice

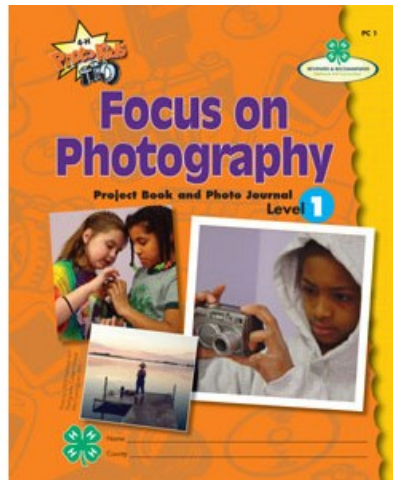
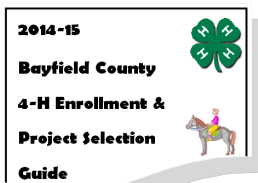
- Take a pile of small chopped broccoli, sprinkle it in the bottom of a muffin tin.

Reenrolling for the 2014-15 4-H Year

As begun in 2014, all 4H enrollments will continue to be done online. Step by step instructions for updating your family's information in 4HOnline will be provided to you by your club leader in the Bayfield County 4H Enrollment and Project Guide. Re-enrollment will be easier this year since all you need to do is update the information you submitted last year.

Selecting Projects:

Refer to the Project Guide to determine the projects that suit you and the proper project level. Grade levels are suggested for most (but not all) units. A 4-H member should limit the number of projects to what he or she can reasonably accomplish in a year. *It's better to do a really good job on one or two projects than a halfway job on a bunch of projects.* Parents need to approve and support the project decisions their child makes.

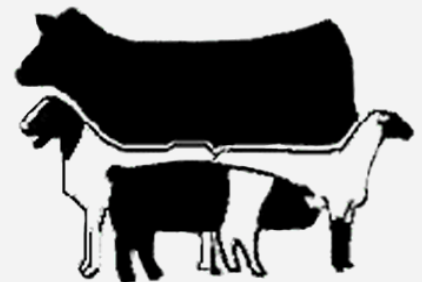

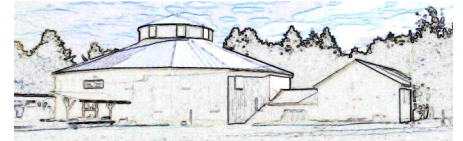
