Dear 4-H Families:

Now that you have enrolled for the new 4-H year, you may be asking the question "What do I do next?" The answer varies depending on your role in the 4-H program.

If you are a Project Leader: You should start by setting a date for your first project meeting, with the goal of leading 4-6 project meetings in the year. Next, find out who wants to learn what you have to teach. You can ask either your club organizational leader or the 4-H office for a contact list of members enrolled in the project. If you'd like to open up your meeting to interested members in neighboring clubs, that is also an option. Next, communicate to them the meeting date, time and place. Work with your members at that first meeting to set some goals for what can be learned and accomplished at the meetings.

4-H project literature is available from the 4H office free of charge to support your work. Take a look at the 4H Enrollment and Project Guide to see what is available. You can find it on our website here https://bayfield.extension.wisc.edu/how-do-i-join/ There is also a vast network of resources available on the Internet, as well as our public libraries. If you would like help printing resources online or have any project related questions, contact either Ian or Donna at the 4-H office. We are also your link to the greater University System and in many cases there are resources available beyond 4-H literature like videos and lesson plans.

**4-H Members and Parents:** Do you know the name of the 4-H project leader for the projects your son or daughter has enrolled in? If not, ask your club leader and if there is not a project leader for a project they enrolled in, call lan or Donna in the Extension office and we can help you determine if a neighboring club has a leader that has room for you to participate in their meetings. If there are no project leaders available, think about someone in the community that has skill or experience in this area and ask them if they would consider becoming a 4-H Project Leader. Adults in the community do not have to be certified 4-H project leaders if there is a certified 4-H project leader present at the project meetings.

For everyone: stay connected and participate as much as possible with your club meetings and events. This is at the heart of the 4H experience. It is about building community, sharing, and supporting one another with the talents and gifts each of us has to offer.

With that, we here at the 4H and Extension office wish you and your family a wonderful holiday season.



Treasurers report read.


Old business, was the fair, our booth won a Blue ribbon, it was a super cute set up and very bright. The group worked at the 4-H fair booth on Sunday.

# Attention 4-H Club Treasurers & Leaders

As you are probably aware, keeping good club treasury records is more important than ever. You may have also discovered that it's much easier to keep an accurate, on-going record of income and payments than to try and recreate it later. To get off to a good start this year we strongly urge you to do the following:

Use the "Club Financial Records" forms found on our website at http://bayfield.uwex.edu/4-h-youth -development/. If you use the Excel document the math is done for you! Treasurers can type in and save this document to their own computers.

A second NEW record keeping form called 4H Club Treasurers Report— NEW is available on request. If you use this one it will automatically generate the financial information needed for the Club Charter.

**Start your records as of July 1**, **2019.** July 1, 2019 – June 30, 2020 is the period of activity that will need to be audited next year. We need to get in the habit of using these dates.

Treasurers need to work closely with an adult who can help them understand how to do their job and the importance of it to their club as a whole.

Remember that financial records tell a story about what your club values and supports. Add enough detail to the lines to explain where the money came from or why it was paid out. If money is paid to an individual, tell why (i.e. camp scholarship, reimbursement for supplies, etc.).

We know you are all good stewards of the money in your treasuries and keeping detailed records takes some work, but in the end, remember it teaches us all about handling money and being accountable, life lessons worth learning.



# County Van Available for 4-H Programs

Bayfield County 4-H has access to a 11-passenger van. This van is available for club and project leaders once they have completed a short drivers certification program.

The process for using the van will include reserving the van at least a week in advance and having a driver available who has been certified by the county. This certification will cover defensive driving techniques, a background check on their driving record and a drive in the van.

# Report on Food Booth from Jill Zifko

The following suggestions/comments were discussed:

- Potatoes were not recommended for 2020. Did not sell well, hard to control quality throughout the day.
- Nachos, veggie trays, and tacos sold very well and are recommended for 2020.
- The pizza ovens are slow and it is recommended to research a new method of cooking pizzas.
- Ask clubs to bring and freeze burger for sloppy joes or pre-buy sloppy joe mix from Upper Lakes Food. Preparation of the burger was very time consuming and difficult.

Revert back to two food order lines rather than one.

- Stress to clubs the importance of having enough workers for each shift.
- Crew passes are available for Food Booth staff (Jill, husband, children) as is a camping pass.
- Travel to and from was expensive and a stipend for transportation for the Food Booth Manager needs to be considered.

Attach drainage hose to freezer so that it can drain

to the outside.

Better/more ice cream scoops are recommended.

- Place a screen on the water dump container so that towels/utensils are not accidentally lost.
- Consider providing a \$300 Visa card or cash for manager to pre-buy supplies. Currently, the Manager purchases these items and is then reimbursed. Providing funds in advance will help eliminate financial strain to Manager.
- Be sure to provide the Manager with the tax exempt card well in advance of the Fair.
- The soda cooler that says "Coca-Cola" was making a strange noise and it is recommended for service.
- **Reflections on Fair** long waits to pick up art projects on Sunday.
- Older Member Awards letters went out to awardees last week.
- **Club Awards** Donna has many of these is waiting on a few other clubs.

#### New Business

- **Dairy Breakfast** A meeting of all parties involved is tentatively planned for January. At least one Bayfield County representative should attend. The three primary organizing units are Ashland FFA, Ashland Co. 4-H and Bayfield Co. 4-H Leaders Association.
- **Review Budget** Some adjustments are still necessary and Ian needs to provide input. Sarah P. asked that the budget for trophies be increased to allow for the purchase of alternatives to trophies such as buckets, halters or hay racks. These would be engraved with the award

information and would replace traditional trophies. Amanda asked that we consider including 4-H horse awards in our ceremony which may also include an increase in this budget amount.

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
