Summer COVID-19 Guidelines for 4-H Meetings & Events

- Indoor Events can have up to 350 attendees, or up to 50% room capacity.
- Outdoor events can have up to 500 attendees
- Face masks are required while indoors unless eating, and outdoors when less than 6 feet from others.
- Have hand sanitizer and extra masks available at all meetings, contact the 4-H office if you need either of these.
- **Food is allowed** outdoors anytime and indoors if the meeting will last more than 2 hours. While eating try to stay at least 6 feet from each-other.
- The club's secretary or leader should record and save a list of all attendees for each meeting or event.
- Stay home if you have any COVID-19 like symptoms or if you've come into contact with anyone who tested positive in the past 14 days.

Entry Tips

- Your Club Leader will receive all the entry tags for your club. You will need to pick them up from him/ her.
- Affix your tags to your entries with rubber bands provided. Animal entries may have their tags affixed to stalls/pens.
- Give the entry tags for the items you did **NOT** bring to the Fair ("No Shows") to each Department Superintendent at the Fair on Thursday.

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- Bring the items you are entering to the Fairgrounds on Thursday, August 12th from Noon— 7pm. (Your exhibit/ booths must be finished by 7 pm.)
- Learn from your experiences; Watch and listen to the judging.
- Show your entries to friends and family during the Fair.
- Pick up your entries on Sunday from 5:45—7pm. The Bayfield County Fair will not be responsible for any items left after 7 pm.

WANTED: ARCHERY & SHOOTING SPORTS LEADERS

Bayfield County 4-H is looking for adults interested in becoming certified archery and shooting sports instructors.



If you know someone who might be interested, or better yet, if you are interested, please get in touch with Ian at Ian.Meeker@wisc.edu.

We have air rifles, compound, and recurve bows, nets, and targets available for your use. Everything you need to instruct, we just need a certified leader!

There will be a Northern Region Shooting Sports Leader Certification workshop held in Price County on May 22nd. A Wisconsin 4-H Shooting Sports Leader may be certified in archery, coordinator, muzzleloader, pistol, rifle and shotgun disciplines. Leaders may only teach in the discipline in which they are certified. An adult leader cannot provide hands-on or safety instruction without a certified leader supervising the range. This course is being offered on Saturday, May 22, 2021 from 7:45AM to 5:15PM at the Extension Price County office. Archery and Air Rifle/.22 Rifle are the two disciplines being offered during this workshop. You can register for this training on 4H-Online or contact our office and we will sign you up.

UNIQUE OPPORTUNITY FOR CLUBS AT PIKES CREEK



The North Pikes Creek Wetlands is an outdoor education area within a large parcel of unique forested wetlands at the Pikes Creek headwaters. There is an outdoor classroom, and a large boardwalk that travels into the wetlands, an excellent space for bird watching and nature viewing.

WETLANDS The Friends of the North Pikes Creek Wetlands has

binoculars and curriculum for 4-H clubs and families to use at Beaver Hollow (Compton Road, Bayfield). They have 25 pairs of binoculars, 20 fold-out bird guides, a few Peterson and Tekiela guides for leader/older youth to use, and a binocular-use teaching set. They also have some <u>Audubon Adventure</u> curriculums that leaders can use.
