Time to Enroll in the 2021-22 4-H Year!

The new 4-H year has officially begun, and that means it's time to re-enroll and select your projects for this year.

Your general club leader has been mailed paper re-enrollment forms for youth members and adult leaders and volunteers, as well as forms for new members.



You can either fill out a form at an upcoming club meeting, or you can log into <u>https://v2.4honline.com/</u> and click on the blue "enroll now" link next to your name to re-enroll and choose your projects.

Adult Leaders & Volunteers

All adult volunteers are required to reenroll each year. If you would like, you can fill out the paper re-enrollment form but if you decide to go online here are a few tips:

When you go online to re-enroll you will be asked to choose your volunteer type. And you can make multiple selections out of this list.

You will then be asked to select your units (your club) and then to select your projects.

On the drop down project list you will be able to choose whether you want to work at club or county level for each project.

Some of our county clubs are quite small and do not have many leaders, so please consider serving as a county leader. If we have a youth member who does not have a project leader, we can get them in touch with you so that they have the opportunity to learn from you or join in on your project meetings

Selecting Projects:

Refer to the <u>WI 4-H Project Guide</u> to choose your projects. Your leaders were mailed paper copies, but this is also located online at: <u>https://4h.extension.wisc.edu/</u> <u>files/2020/10/4H218-Guide-with-</u> <u>Supplements-2022.pdf</u>. Grade levels are suggested for most units.

A 4-H member should limit the number of projects to what he or she can reasonably accomplish in a year.

It's better to do a really good job on one or two projects than a halfway job on a bunch of projects.

We recommend choosing 2-4 projects to focus on each year.

Need Literature?

Many good, up-to-date printed resources are available to help you learn about your project. 4H Literature we have on hand will be provided FREE to enrolled members and leaders. We have a large amount in stock and want to get it into our members' hands! Inside the Project Selection Guide you will find a literature/resource titles below each project description. Please



jot down a list of the materials your family would like.

You may turn your list into your club leader or directly to the 4H office.

What is a 4H Project?

A 4-H project is simply a topic that you want to learn more about during the year. There are projects on just about any topic you would like to study and explore, from art to woodworking, from computers to rabbits, from clothing to small engines.

Being a part of the county fair is not a requirement in 4-H, but we do encourage you to submit at least one entry for each of your projects.

If you do plan to have entries at the fair, remember that your entries should coincide with the projects you signed up for. It may be helpful to take a look at the previous years fair premium list to get an idea of what can be entered. We have extra copies at the courthouse, just email the office if you need one.

If you are new to 4-H, your leaders will be able to help you out and answer any questions you may have, but as always you can give our county 4-H office a call and we will be happy to help you out with your project selections!

Some special projects to consider:



Are you interested in learning how to paddle a canoe or kayak, rock climb, mountain bike, sail, kiteboard or plan for and go on backpacking and camping trips? Would you like the opportunity to explore northern Wisconsin with other county youth and skilled instructors? If so, consider choosing Superior Adventures as one of your Units (clubs). Trips will be planned according to age and ability throughout the next year and are in most cases free of charge and group transportation to sites is provided.

Cloverbuds

Members in grades K-2 can only enroll in Cloverbuds, Exploring, and Afterschool projects. They can show a variety of items at the fair but are put into a special Cloverbud category.

CANSKI (Chequamegon Area Nordic Ski)

This is a special 4-H interest club that all Bayfield Youth can join. When you go to re-enroll, just choose CANSKI as one of your clubs in addition to your regular community club. The mission of 4H-CANSKI is to promote fun, fitness, safety and excellence in the lifelong sport of cross country skiing. 4H-CANSKI provides ongoing instruction, social opportunities and leadership development for skiers of all levels. We will emphasize technique, conditioning, safety and provide leadership opportunities all in a fun filled atmosphere in the great outdoors. Youth are split into groups based on age and receive instruction from skilled leaders. Instruction takes place at Mt.Ashwabay in Bayfield, WI, usually on Tuesday and Thursday

evenings and generally runs January-March.

Sewing Camp

Choose sewing or clothing as one of your projects and join us in February for a day-long workshop where you can work with county leaders and youth to complete fun sewing projects.

Clothing Revue

Clothing revue is a fun pre-fair judged event that usually takes place in June. Show of your project work and have it formally judged. There are also opportunities to take Cultural Arts Festival in April, as part in state Clothing Revue. You must be enrolled in clothing, sewing, knitting, or crocheting projects to take part.

Foods Revue

A fun pre-fair judged event that usually takes place in May. You must be enrolled in the Food & Nutrition project to take part. A theme is chosen, and you will plan a nutritious menu based on that theme and use what you have learned about food and nutrition to cook a delicious food item.

Market Sale

Open to 4-H members 12 and older who have previous experience in beef, sheep, swine, or goat projects. This is a unique opportunity to sell your animals at

the annual Bayfield County 4-H Market Sale held during the Bayfield County Fair. For more information contact Marla Lahti at bmlahti@cheqnet.net.

Service Learning

Work individually or as a group to address local and global needs, and plan and execute a service project. There is also opportunity to attend a 3 day Service Learning conference in Minneapolis where you can become inspired, learn,

connect, and take action with youth and adult leaders.

Performing Arts

Work as a group to develop a play, puppet show, dance, or musical performance and perform your work at our annual Culural Arts Festival in April. We encourage all clubs to take part!

2021 Cedar Crest 4-H Flavor Contest





<u>Cedar Crest Ice Cream</u>, Cedarburg, Wisconsin, and the <u>Wisconsin 4-H Foundation</u> have teamed up again to present the "Cedar Crest Ice Cream 4-H Flavor Contest" for Wisconsin 4-H clubs. More than 1600 clubs are eligible to create and submit a flavor 'recipe' with the top clubs named as finalists, and the top flavor produced for summer 2022.

According to Brenda Scheider, Executive Director of the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation, the contest is a great opportunity for 4-H youth to work together to develop and name their flavor. "The most exciting part of the contest is the winning flavor



will be available through Cedar Crest beginning next July." The annual contest has already yielded popular flavors including Deep Woods, created by the Baraboo Valley 4-H Club and Wisconsin Campfire S'mores, created by the Springbrook 4-H Club of New Richmond. This year's winning flavor was Tractor Tracks, created by the Country Clover 4-H Club in Green Lake County.

A panel of ice cream experts chosen by Cedar Crest judges the entries. The company manufacturers more than 80 flavors of ice cream, along with frozen custard, sherbet and sorbet at its Manitowoc, Wisconsin, plant, and distributes products in five states. Many of the flavors now produced by Cedar Crest, including Wisconsin Campfire S'mores and Big Muddy, are a result of the contest.
