## Lake Topside Days

Did you know that Bayfield County 4-H owns 60 acres on the south shore of Lake Topside just outside of Iron River? The property includes the entire south shore of the lake and has plenty of interesting topography and beautiful forestland with some established trails. The property has not seen much use in past years. It is a rustic space with a shelter, privy, and dock, all which need maintenance and repair. It is however a unique space, and all 4-H families are welcome to make use of the property. We do ask that you give our office a call before you visit the site.



We are hoping to renew some interest and caretaking energy for the site and will be holding monthly 4-H activities at Topside starting in May of this year.

We will start things off with a cleanup day on **Wednesday May 18th**. We will meet at the shelter at 4pm, get familiarized with the property and trail system, then work together to clean up the main shelter and meeting area and work on clearing the existing trail to the dock and lake. At 6pm we will wrap things up with a campfire and roasted brats and hot dogs, fixins and smores.

If your club or family would like to help, please contact the 4-H office so that we can make sure we have enough tools and food for everyone. Don't have time to help with the cleanup but want to just come out for a campfire? No problem, just let us know!

Please be on the lookout for future Topside events, or let us know if you have any ideas. Current ideas for future events include:

- Plant identification workshop

Each year, 4-H parents, members, & leaders have the chance to nominate someone they feel has played an important role in their time in 4-H and made a difference in the lives of our county's youth.

At our April 2nd Awards & Recognition Banquet we presented Bayfield County 4-H Hall of Fame awards to Roger Branham & Agnes Farkas.



**Roger Branham** is our 2021 Bayfield County 4-H Lifetime Volunteer Award recipient. Roger has been involved in the 4-H program his whole life. He and was a part of the Stanford Friendly farmers & Rice Lake Rangers 4-H Club as he grew up in Barron County. Once in Bayfield County he made sure his own children were involved in the 4-H program and served as a club project leader for the Clover Valley 4-H Club. He then went on to become general leader of Clover Valley in 2014 and continued in that position even after his children had graduated out of the program. In his time as a leader, he was very active with the 4-H Market Sale and helped families in the beef and swine projects as well as the air rifle project within his club and countywide. In addition, he stepped up as a leader and was active within the Bayfield County Leader's Association and served as the organization's president from 2015 to 2018.



**Agnes Farkas** is our 2021 Bayfield County 4-H Outstanding Alumni Award. Agnes has been a part of Bayfield County 4-H for almost her entire life! From the age of 10, she was a member of the Pine Creek 4-H Club. As she grew up and had children, she instilled a love for 4-H in them and became a leader for Pine Creek and the Friendly Farmers 4-H Club. She has now been a 4-H leader for 47 years and a part of Bayfield County 4-H since 1949, that is 73 years of involvement in Bayfield County 4-H! In her time as a 4-H leader she has helped youth with many projects including sewing, knitting, foods & nutrition, rabbits, dairy, & beef. She has also volunteered her time at many of the countywide 4-H activities and programs such as Camp, Cultural Arts, 4-H Congress, Washington Focus, Exchange programs, 4-H Labo & Traveler and especially the Bayfield County Fair & 4-H Food Booth.

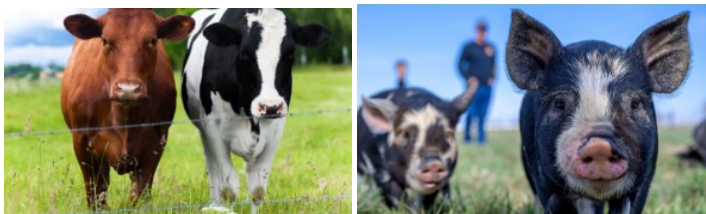

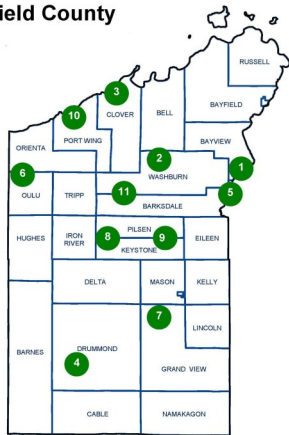
