DRAWING FACES

Project: Drawing Ages: 12-18 Date: Thursday October 13th

Are you making funny faces? Are you afraid they're going to get stuck that way? In this 2 hour session taught by local artist and teacher Kitty Crawford, students will learn how to draw facial features in correct proportion. We will go over simple measurements & tips and tricks to create a more realistic drawing. Students should bring a pencil and some paper or a sketchbook to draw and practice along with the instructor.



BEGINNING POTTERY TECHNIQUES Ages: 6-10 Date: Wednesday October 19th Project: Pottery

Join instructor Michael McKenna, owner of Smiling Sun Pottery in playing and experimenting with clay. You will learn coil, pinch, and slab handbuilding techniques and will explore different ways to pattern, imprint, and create different design elements using natural materials. Projects created during this workshop will be fired and a second class will be scheduled where students will glaze and finish their projects.
