SHEEP PROJECT MINI-GRANT APPLICATION

The purpose of this mini-grant request is to secure funds to purchase grooming equipment for use by 4H members enrolled in the sheep project. Specifically, the equipment purchased includes sheep trimmers and a livestock blow dryer.

Grooming and fitting sheep are a very important part of the project and is a skill that is developed over time. However, the type of equipment needed is very expensive, not affordable to every member, and is typically acquired over many years. For new 4H'ers starting in the sheep project this can be a hinderance. Lack of access to equipment creates a clear line between the "haves" and "have nots". If all sheep participants have access to grooming equipment, it helps level the playing field a bit.

In the past, the sheep members have shared equipment and thus shared in the work of fitting and grooming each other's sheep. This creates comradery in the barn and makes the competition in the show ring more enjoyable. Seeing the participants sharing in other's successes is truly what 4H competition is about. When it is a team effort, it puts a nice shine on the successes.

The issue with sharing equipment, is that when 4H members age out or move on to other projects, the equipment leaves the barn. Often there is a lack of grooming supplies until the another 4Her purchases the "missing" equipment. The goal would be to have a set of community equipment that would stay with the project, regardless of leader and participant changes.

Currently, there are several beginning members in the sheep project community. We have seen steady growth enrolling one new member each of the last three years. Making sure kids are successful helps ensure they continue in the project. Having access to cost-prohibitive equipment will eliminate one hurdle in an already expensive project. The ultimate goal is that as the project grows, sheep project participants will be able to start fundraising to purchase other equipment.
