4-H SCHOLARSHIP

BAYFIELD COUNTY 4-H LEADERS ASSOCIATION, INC.

The 4-H Leaders Association has designated \$1000 to this scholarship fund and will award up to two \$500 scholarships each year.

- A. Requirements for eligibility are as follows:
 - 1. Must have been a Bayfield County 4-H member (minimum of three years) at the time of high school graduation.
 - 2. *Must be registered for post high school courses at the time the scholarship is awarded.*
 - 3. Must have the application blank, essay, and activities list completed and returned to the Bayfield County 4-H Youth Development staff by **March 15** of each year. Applications received after this time will not be considered.
 - 4. Must have two letters of reference to be returned separately to the Bayfield County 4-H Youth Development staff. (One reference must be a current 4-H leader. The other reference may be any unrelated adult – teacher, minister, etc.) The references should include any comments the adults care to make, the **date**, and **signature** of the reference giver.
- B. Application Instructions:
 - 1. Write an essay of 400-500 words on "How I Have Grown Through 4-H."
 - 2. Describe in a separate document the 4-H and non 4-H activities you have participated in. **Describe accomplishments and/or leadership roles in 3 areas**:
 - 1. Club roles and activities (maximum 5)
 - 2. County, district, state, and national 4-H events (maximum 5)
 - 3. Non-4-H roles and activities (maximum 5).
- C. Selection Information
 - 1. The applications will be submitted to the Bayfield County 4-H Leaders Association Executive Board for selection of the winner.
 - 2. The scholarship will be awarded at graduation time and the applicant will be recognized at the 4-H Awards and Recognition Banquet in the fall.
 - 3. Scholarship application blanks will be mailed directly to 4-H members in the 12th grade and announced in the January 4-H newsletter.
 - 4. Selection criteria will be based 25% on the essay, 25% on 4-H club activities and leadership, 25% on 4-H county (and beyond) activities and leadership, 15% on non-4-H activities, and 10% on references.
