

- Please consider stepping up and taking on a role within our Bayfield County 4-H Leaders Association! We currently have a small but mighty group of 4-H leaders that are doing the work of the Bayfield County 4-H Leaders Association AND ALSO leading their clubs. We are in need of support from other 4-H volunteers in our county that are passionate about 4-H and want to see the program thrive and succeed in our county.

Thank you for signing up for the 4-H year on 4HOnline! So now what?

The enrollment period for the 4-H year closes **TODAY**. Please make sure that you have signed your children up for all the projects they are interested in by the end of this week. Feel free to reach out to Kaylie at the 4-H office if you need to add or change anything, or if you want to double check on project lists.

Next week- November 4-8th the 4-H office will put together and distribute:

- Club lists- to club leaders
- **Project leader lists**
- Youth project lists- to our project leaders.

November is a great time to get connected with project leaders and develop goals and a plan for your 4-H project work.

We recommend starting a 4-H project record for each of the projects you are enrolled in.

The Wisconsin 4-H Projects Website is also a great resource. This site has age-based skills and focuses for many of the popular 4-H projects, and provides some ideas for project related goals and activities.

DO YOU HAVE 4-H PROJECT **CURRICULUM THAT YOU ARE NO** LONGER USING? PLEASE RETURN IT TO YOUR CLUB LEADER! This will allow us to continue having a 4-H curriculum library for our county's 4-H families.

What is expected of 4-H members?

- Attend your club's meetings & activities- Strive to be an active 4-H member by regularly attending your club's meetings and activities.
- Be a leader- 4-H has many youth leadership opportunities!
 - Consider running for a club officer position.
 - Help your club to plan an event, community service project, or activity.
 - Become a youth project leader- older 4-H members who have been involved in a specific project for several years can take on a leadership role as a youth project leader and teach younger members about that project area.
 - Become a **Junior Leader** older 4-H members that like to work with younger youth might consider providing guidance and support to the club's younger members.
- Keep a 4-H Record Book and a Permanent Record
 - Take part in countywide 4-H events:
 - Spring's 4-H Cultural Arts Festival & Project Showcases
 - Plan a group or individual performance for Cultural Arts! Options include plays, puppet shows, dancing, singing, instrument playing, & more.
 - Enter your artwork, crafts, woodworking, creative writing & photography that you worked on over the winter. These same items can also be entered into the fair! This is a great chance to receive constructive feedback on the project work you are doing.
 - Plan a demonstration for the <u>4-H Demonstration Contest</u>
 - Enter in the 4-H Foods Revue
 - ◆ If you like to sew, knit, or crochet- enter in the 4-H Clothing & Textiles Revue
 - Attend our <u>Bayfield County 4-H Summer Camp</u>
 - Grow a giant pumpkin or sunflower for our annual contest.
 - Bayfield County Junior Fair- The 4-H year culminates with the Bayfield County Fair. As you plan your 4-H project work- start thinking about what you would like to enter at the 2025 fair. Start looking through the fair's <u>premium list</u> NOW and plan out what you'd like to enter. Start working on your entries this winter, so they are ready to go by fair time!
 - Check your emails regularly and read your paper newsletters- Keep an eye out for state 4-H
 opportunities and other countywide 4-H events that you can sign up for throughout the year.

A note for 4-H Parents & Guardians:

We are in need of adult volunteers and project leaders. Please consider getting involved at the club or county level in some capacity!

How can you get involved?

- **Become a project leader** for one of the projects your child is interested in. As a project leader, we will give you a list of other youth in your club or area that signed up for the project. Project leaders typically meet with a small group of youth 4-6 times a year and help to guide youth in their project learning, and plan activities, and outings related to the project.
- Help your club's organizational leader(s)- our club leaders need your support! Please reach out to them and see what you might be able to help with in your club.
- Join a <u>Bayfield County 4-H Leaders Association</u> committee- look for a committee sign up form at and after our annual meeting on November 18th. We are in need of parents to help plan and organize countywide events, activities, & fundraisers and more.
